YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO SEXUAL HEALTH SERVICES

Are you age 12 or older?

Then you do **NOT** need **ANYONE's** permission to get most sexual health services like:

- HIV testing & treatment
- STD testing & treatment
- Mental Health Counseling
- Birth control & CONDOMS
- Pregnancy testing & care
- Emergency contraception (“morning-after pill”)
- Abortion

—IT'S THE LAW—

WHO IS THIS GUIDE FOR?

Youth (**age 12 and up**) who:

- Have had sex
- Are having sex
- Will someday have sex

WHY DO I NEED SEXUAL HEALTH SERVICES?

To help you protect yourself & your partner from HIV, STDs & unplanned pregnancy.

WHY THESE CLINICS?

These clinics are good at providing services to youth including young men of color and LGBTQ youth .

CONFIDENTIALITY

- What you tell your doctor is between YOU and THEM.
- They are not allowed to tell anyone —**even your parents**— unless you say its ok!

A few exceptions:

If you say...

- Someone is hurting you or you're hurting yourself
- You're 15 or younger and have an OLDER sex partner (especially a much older one)...they may need to tell someone to keep you safe.

Question? Ask you doctor!

KNOW AND PROTECT YOUR RIGHTS!

You Have the Right to:

- Get confidential & private care
- Get care without being judged
- Learn about all your options
- Know your test results and what they mean
- Have everything explained to you
- Choose or refuse any procedure, test or treatment
- Get most sexual health services without a parent's permission (if you are 12 or older)

Q. WHAT IF I HAVE NO MONEY?

A. NO PROBLEM MANY CLINICS WILL SEE YOU AT NO COST!

All clinics in this guide accept Family PACT or Medi-Cal (two government programs), so services should not cost you anything. All County STD clinics offer care at no charge.

WHAT WILL MY DOCTOR ASK ME?

To help give you the right care, your doctor will ask questions.

What you tell them is **PRIVATE**.

They might ask things like:

- Are you having sex?
- Have you had sex with men, women, or both?
- How often do use drugs or alcohol?

If you are getting tested for HIV & STDs:

- When was the last time you got tested?
- How many sex partners do you have?
- Do you have a safer sex plan?

The doctor has heard it all, and can best help you when you tell the truth!

USE THIS GUIDE TO FIND CLINICS IN LOS ANGELES

These clinics all:

- See a lot of teens and young men of color
- Offer confidential sexual health services, including HIV & STD testing and treatment, as well as birth control
- Offer services at no or very low cost, including prescriptions

- If the wait is long, ask for a separate waiting room for privacy.
- Some clinics will see you faster if they know you're a student.
- You can ask for a male or female doctor.

You can ask questions, like:

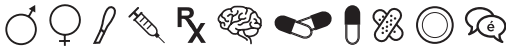
- Will you call my parents or send mail? (the answer is NO)

- How do I take the medicine?

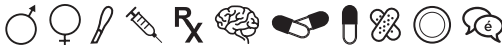
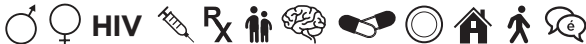
Q. WILL MY PARENT FIND OUT?**A. YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO PRIVACY!**

If you're at least 12 years old, the law says the doctor CANNOT tell your parents about your sexual health services, without YOUR permission. Even if you are on their insurance there are ways to maintain confidentiality.

What is PEP?

- Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) is an emergency treatment that can reduce your chances of becoming infected with H.I.V., the virus that causes A.I.D.S., after you had a high risk exposure, for example unprotected sex or sharing needles.
- The treatment is an emergency because the medical services must begin within 72 hours (3 days) after the exposure. The sooner you begin PEP treatment, the more effective it will be.
- PEP consists of 28 days of antiretroviral drug therapy - medicines in pill form that slow down or stop HIV from reproducing in the body. Antiretroviral drugs are the type of medicine that HIV-positive people take to stay healthy.

What is PrEP?

- Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) is a daily pill taken by people, who are HIV-negative, before they are potentially exposed to HIV.
- PrEP has been shown to reduce the risk of HIV infection by up to 92% when taken consistently.
- Currently, the FDA has approved Truvada to be prescribed as PrEP.

What is a High-risk HIV Exposure?

- Having sex or sharing needles with a known HIV-positive partner or a partner of unknown status and one of the following events:
- Unprotected receptive anal sex or with a failed condom
- Unprotected insertive anal sex or with a failed condom
- Unprotected receptive vaginal intercourse or with a failed condom
- Unprotected insertive vaginal intercourse or with a failed condom
- Sharing injection drug paraphernalia

If you believe you've been exposed to HIV, please contact a provider ASAP for more details or go to your doctor.
